NOTIFICATION

Sub: Modalities of one mid-term examination system.

In accordance with the decision taken by the Senate in its 38th meeting held on 16th November, 2018 under Item No. 38-3.10, a committee was constituted to finalize the modalities for implementation of one mid-term examination system instead of the existing two mid-term examination system for all semesters starting from July 2019 and onward semesters. On the basis of recommendation of the committee, the following modalities shall be applicable for both the UG and PG evaluations:

The evaluation of students in a course is a continuous process and is based on their performance in Class Work Sessionals (CWS), Mid-Term Examinations (MTE), and End-Term Examinations (ETE). The Class work Sessional Exams shall include quizzes, tutorials, home work assignments, term papers, seminars, surprise tests/ class tests/ MCQ tests/ Open book tests/ Group activities, etc. and may be conducted by the Course Instructor/ Coordinator during the semester as per his/her course plan. Laboratory courses will have Practical Sessionals (PRS) such as practicals, field work, etc. and a Practical End Term Exam (PRE). **The course coordinator will announce the modes of evaluation and distribution of weightage for each component at the beginning of the course.**

Various modes of assessment for theory and laboratory courses along with recommended relative weightage of various components are given in Table. A large departure from the recommended modes of assessments and weightage will require prior approval from the Dean of Academics.

Relative weightage for in semester evaluation in theory courses is typically 50 percent. This will consist of one-mid semester test of one and half hours duration, of 30 percent weightage, to be held as per the schedule fixed in the academic calendar. Assignments/Tutorials/Class Performance/Quizzes/Term Project (CWS) shall make up 20 percent of the in-semester assessment.

The semester end term examination will be held as per the Academic calendar, and the relative weightage for this is 50 percent. It is two and half hours duration and will cover the full syllabus of the course. It is mandatory for the student to appear in the ETE.
