Mr. Vishal Kumar (ID No. 2011PST5125) was admitted to the M.Tech. Structural Engineering as a full-time student in the academic year 2011-12. His status was converted to a part-time student in the IV Semester (even Semester 2012-13) as a full-time student. He completed the requirements for the award of M.Tech. Degree in V Semester i.e.in two and half years (examination of V Semester held on 27 March 2014) with CGPA of 6.69. Accordingly, he was issued the semester grade sheets of I to V Semester. Due to oversight, his name has not been placed before the Senate for the award of M.Tech Degree till date. The SPGB, in its 60th meeting held on 11th December 2023, approved and recommended his name for the award of degree in the 17th convocation of the institute.

The new UG scheme has been implemented from the academic year 2022-23. Few courses of old scheme have been discontinued in the new scheme while the credits of few courses have been modified. Similarly, few courses have been shifted from odd semester to even semester and vice-versa.

Four 2021 batch students of Dept. of Mechanical Engg. have FA grade in a 4 credit course, which is a core course and was taught in the odd semester as per the old scheme. This course has been modified to a 3 credit course and is being taught in the even semester now. Hence, those four students can register for this course in Even semester 2023-24, which will be their 6th semester and therefore, may affect their internship and placement opportunities.

The DUGC, Dept. of Mechanical Engineering has proposed to conduct this course in hybrid mode, which has been recommended by the SUGB also.

3. UG Degree : No need to change the format

B. Registration Number: The committee explored the idea of using Aadhaar numbers as universal identifiers for students in the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) via the National Academic Depository (NAD). This could have streamlined the process and provided consistency across institutions. However, we have received a letter from the Government of India, Ministry of Education, dated August 23, 2023, which stated that printing Aadhaar numbers on provisional certificates and degrees is not allowed.

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In light of this development, the committee discuss the issue with the NAD team, who informed us that they are in the process of developing a unique identification system within the framework of the Academic Performance Analysis and Review (APAR) platform.

Considering these factors, the committee is of the opinion that deci the implementation of a unique identifier using Aadhaar numbers. Instead, we will proceed with distributing degrees in the upcoming convocation for the academic session 2023 without including the registration number of the unique ID

C English Hindi Names of UG and PG Programmes

After careful examination of the Item no 49.1.1 where the senate approved names for UG and PG programs to be printed on degrees, along with the assessment done by a language expert committee. We have discussed the issue in depth and also consulted with scientists from the Commission for Scientific and Technical Terminology (CSTT) in Delhi. Our suggestion for the final printing of course names in Hindi and English is as follows: "The English word '**Computer**' shall be written in Hindi as '**buget**,' while the remaining proposed specializations names in Hindi, as recommended by the Language Expert committee, shall be kept unchanged."

*For Electronics and Communication Engineering if we choose the name as suggested by the Language Expert Committee the departmental boards, signage all will need to be changed. The earlier meeting of Senate had chosen to retain the old name for this reason.

Note: The degree shall be printed first in Hindi and then in English. The same pattern shall be followed while writing the designations of signatories viz first in Hindi and then in English

Justification and need of the initiative ->

- 1. **Establishment:** The Centre for Energy and Environment (CEE) was established 12 years ago as a multidisciplinary platform for renewable energy and sustainable technologies.
- 2. Collaborative beginnings and way forward: Initially, CEE served as a collaborative platform, bringing together adjunct faculties from diverse departments, emphasizing an interdisciplinary approach. Later, in the year 2015 and 2019 CEE added 6 faculty members with diverse background.
- 3. **MTech Program Launch:** Right from its first year, CEE launched an MTech program in Renewable Energy, known for its strong job placement record and research opportunities.
- 4. **NBA Accreditation:** In 2022, the centre's MTech program in Renewable Energy received NBA accreditation for the maximum duration of six years due to its excellent performance.
- 5. Securing Research Projects: CEE has been successful in securing 42 externally funded research projects, demonstrating its excellence in multidisciplinary research. However, we missed FIST because we are not a department.
- 6. Relevant publications by 8 team members in past 3 years→142 Journal papers
- 7. **Comparison with IITs:** Other premier institutions like IITs have transitioned their renewable energy centers into full-fledged departments, enhancing visibility and attractiveness.
- 8. Strategic Transition: The transition from a center to a department could amplify CEE's impact, increase visibility, and solidify its position as a leader in renewable energy and sustainable technologies.
- 9. In short: CEE will flourish more as a department because
 - a. It will have more visibility.
 - b. It will attract more industry oriented externally funded project.
 - c. It will attract more meritorious students in its PG and PhD programs.

Supplementary Agenda Item for consideration at the 53rd Meeting of the Senate of MNIT Jaipur:

Renaming the National Centre for Disaster Mitigation and Management as **Department of Earthquake Engineering**

1. Urgency

The following are the salient reasons for taking up the agenda item for discussion of the Senate of MNIT Jaipur. The *urgency of the matter* is explained as under.

- (1) The process must be completed before the announcement of *M.Tech. admission* by the *Centralized Counselling for M.Tech. Admissions* (CCMT 2024) so that potential candidates can apply for the re-launched Maters' Program, namely *M. Tech. (Earthquake Engineering)* with specialisation in Earthquake Resistant Design; and
- (2) The timely action will also help in inviting new admission in the Sponsored Candidates category in the Maters' Program, namely, *M. Tech. (Earthquake Engineering) with specialisation in Dam Safety.* To facilitate this a *letter* should go to the Major Dam Owners across the country through *National Dam Safety Authority*, Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India, for seeking admission in the program under the sponsored category, this has become very relevant after *The Dam Safety Act*, 2021.

This request is being made as per the relevant provisions of the First Statutes of NITs.

2. Relevant Provisions of the First Statutes of the NITs

The following are the relevant provisions of the Statutes of MNIT Jaipur:

- (1) Statute No. 2 (1): Definitions
 - (d) "Centre" in relation to an Institute means an academic unit of the Institute engaged in academic activities (like teaching, research, etc.) generally of an inter-disciplinary nature.
 - (e) "Centre" in relation to an Institute means an academic unit of the Institute engaged in academic activities (like teaching, research, etc.).
- (2) Statute No. 8: Powers of the Senate
 - (xii) make recommendations to the Board with regard to the *creation or restructuring* of Departments or Programmes or Centres and the abolition of existing Departments or centres thereof.

3. Background

The National Centre for Disaster Mitigation and Management was created in the 27th Meeting of the Board of Governors of MNIT Jaipur (held on 7th October 2013, Item No. 27-4.2). The Centre has been running *M.Tech. (Earthquake Engineering)* since 2015 and produced 10 Doctoral Thesis in the domain of Earthquake Engineering. Currently, there are 7 registered doctoral students. And, the Centre has *two* Faculty Members appointed directly under the Centre and *two* Faculty Members are attached to the Centre from the Department of Civil Engineering, with background in Earthquake Engineering.

The Centre has following activities within its ambit:

- (1) *National Earthquake Testing Facility (NETF)* is a state-of-the-art facility engaged with industry partners, for *Qualification, Certification* and *Development* of new and emerging technologies for evaluating earthquake performance of buildings and bridges through *full-scale testing,* particularly the *mass housing* in India. Currently:
 - (a) M/s B. G. Shirke Constructions Private Limited, Pune, has made a significant pledge to

the Institute towards establishing the long-term R&D initiatives in the domain of earthquake safety of building including full-scale testing. A few other companies are approaching to engage with the NETF for full-scale testing.

- (b) The Ministry of Steel, Government of India, jointly with the Ministry of Urban Affairs, Government of India, has funded a project for Technology Development for Promotion of Steel in Construction for Mass Housing under Pradhan Mantri Housing Yojana. Five major steel manufacturers, namely, Tata Steel, SAIL, JSW, JSPL and AM&NS are cofunders of this Project (Financial Outlay: Rs. 4.5 Crores).
- (2) National Centre for Earthquake Safety of Dams (NCESD) is a flagship project of the Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India, for effective implementation of The Dam Safety Act, 2021. (Financial Outlay: Rs. 30.0 Crores).
- (3) *Development of earthquake safety standards* is a major effort underway of the Centre in collaboration with the *Earthquake Engineering Sectional Committee CED39* of the *Bureau of Indian Standards*, Government of India, New Delhi. The standards published and under preparation are:
 - (a) Earthquake Resistant Design & Detailing of Base-Isolated Buildings,
 - (b) *Earthquake Testing* of Structures, and
 - (c) Earthquake Hazard, Earthquake Resistant Design & Detailing, and Earthquake Safety Assessment & Retrofit of Dams and Embankments.

4. Salient Reasons for Renaming

The reasons for this fall in three broad categories.

- (1) The focus of the activities of the NCDMM largely has been in the domain of *earthquake* safety of the built environment, in all three aspects, namely *teaching*, *research* and *national development*. So, suitably naming the *Academic Unit* as *Department of Earthquake Engineering* is more appropriate, relevant and justifiable. By renaming, the Centre will be able to attract more:
 - (a) Competent applicants for Faculty Positions, and
 - (b) Academically bright Masters and Doctoral students and Post-Doctoral Fellows.
- (2) The Centre has been actively engaged with industry in a significant manner for *technology*, *qualification*, *certification* and *development* for *earthquake safety*. Hence, it is even more appropriate that the name should highlight the focus of the activities.
- (3) The Centre is in active and continuous engagement with Government and Private Sectors in the domain of *earthquake safety* and *resilient infrastructure*.

The activities of the Centre center solely in the domain of *Earthquake Engineering*. So far, the Centre has been successful in getting significant financial support from Government and Private Sectors.

Further, the Centre is planning to re-launch the *M.Tech.* (*Earthquake Engineering*) *Program* with two *Minor Specialisations*, namely:

- (a) *Earthquake Dam Safety*, specifically targeted to dam engineers, which has become extremely relevant in the aftermath of the *Dam Safety Act*, 2021, and is the expectation of the *Ministry of Jal Shakti*, *Government of India*, as articulated in the road map of the *National Centre for Earthquake Safety of Dams* established at MNIT Jaipur, and
- (b) *Earthquake Resistant Design of Structures*, which is extremely relevant in the context of over 60% of India's landmass and its population under the exposure to moderate to severe earthquake hazard.
