The **Film Making Club of Malaviya National Institute of Technology (MNIT)** organized a **Short Film Screening** on **28 January**, from **4:00 PM to 6:00 PM**, at **Niti Sabhagar**. The event was conducted with the objective of promoting cinematic literacy, encouraging creative expression, and providing academic exposure to students interested in filmmaking and visual storytelling. The primary aim of the event was to inspire aspiring filmmakers by showcasing student-made cinema and facilitating direct interaction with a filmmaker. The event was open to filmmaking enthusiasts, students with an interest in cinema, and the general audience within the institute. Approximately **100 participants** attended the screening, reflecting significant interest and active engagement.

The event commenced with the screening of the short film **“Silayi Machine”**, directed by **Shalvin Didwaniya**, an alumnus of MNIT. The film served as an effective learning resource for students, offering insights into narrative construction, direction, and independent film production. Following the screening, the director addressed the audience and shared his creative journey, the conceptual development of the film, and the challenges encountered during the filmmaking process.

A structured **question-and-answer session** was subsequently conducted, during which participants actively interacted with the director. Discussions focused on screenplay writing, direction, production constraints, and audience interpretation. The interactive session encouraged critical thinking and enhanced the overall academic value of the event. The director was then felicitated with a **hamper as a token of appreciation** by the Film Making Club. After the formal proceedings, **refreshments were provided to all attendees**, facilitating informal interaction and networking. Participants were also given the opportunity to **click photographs with the director**, making the event more engaging and memorable. The event concluded with the **orderly dispersal of the audience**, marking the successful completion of the program.

The event effectively met its objectives by fostering creativity, enhancing practical understanding of filmmaking, and promoting experiential learning beyond the classroom.
