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4. Introduction & Objectives

The Travel and Heritage Visit Club, MNIT Jaipur, organized an early-morning heritage trek titled “Twin Tower Trek”, combining adventure, local history, and nature exploration. The trek focused on visiting two abandoned historical towers located in the Aravalli hills of Jaipur, offering participants a unique opportunity to experience heritage beyond textbooks.

Objectives of the Event

- To explore local heritage sites through direct experience
 - To promote outdoor activities and appreciation of nature
 - To encourage bonding and community building among club members
 - To discover lesser-known historical “hidden gems” of Jaipur
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5. Event Description & Logistics

The event commenced early in the morning from the MNIT Jaipur campus. Cabs were arranged by the club to transport participants safely from the campus to the trek base point at Galta Gate, which is approximately 9.5 km from MNIT.

From Galta Gate, participants began the 3-kilometre trek through scenic forest trails of the Aravalli hills, gradually ascending towards the abandoned Twin Towers. The trail offered panoramic views, historical ruins, and a peaceful natural environment.

The trek emphasized enjoyment, exploration, and togetherness rather than speed or physical endurance. Participants engaged in photography, casual discussions, and observation of local heritage structures throughout the journey.

6. Activities Conducted

- **Group Trekking:**
Collective trekking along forested trails leading to the Twin Towers.
 - **Heritage Exploration:**
On-site exploration of the abandoned stone towers and discussion about their historical significance.
 - **Bonfire Session:**
A bonfire was arranged at the top to provide warmth and a relaxed setting for interaction.
 - **Fun & Interactive Games:**
Group games and team activities were conducted to enhance bonding and participation.
 - **Refreshments:**
Snacks and refreshments were shared among participants during the trek.
 - **Photography & Videography:**
Sunrise views, landscapes, towers, and group moments were captured through photographs and cinematic video clips.
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7. Creative Aspects

The event focused on visual storytelling, encouraging participants to capture creative photographs and videos rather than routine documentation. Unique perspectives were explored, such as framing city views through the ancient tower windows. The combination of historic ruins and bonfire lighting created a visually appealing “heritage-meets-modern” atmosphere. Content captured during the trek was intended for a professional after-movie and club social media documentation.

The Twin Tower Trek was entirely self-organized by the Travel and Heritage Visit Club and conducted without any external sponsorship.
