## About the Program

The United Nations **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** or the Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development since 2015 has been an important force in driving the policy agenda at the national level. Stakeholders, including the business organizations, are responding to this development by increasingly showing commitment to the SDGs through disclosures, investment in renewable energy and green buildings, ESG reporting, climate proofing of the business and so on. The recent **Business Responsibility Guidelines** released by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs are also a significant move that make it mandatory for top 1000 listed companies to prepare a **Business Responsibility and Sustainability Report (BRSR)**. In this context, it is important to prepare stakeholders – students, teachers, researchers, consultants and industry managers for understanding strategies for sustainable development.

Sustainability Ambassador Program (SAP) is a series of five-day training sessions to sensitize and prepare stakeholders for the forthcoming **sustainable development challenges** by initiating dialogue, disseminating knowledge and imparting skills on critical issues likeresource efficiency, environmental protection, sustainable financing, green marketing, strategies for circular economy, sustainability reporting etc. in the Indian context.

The **first SAP program** was successfully completed in 2021 with overwhelming response from national and international participants. In-house experts, along with external speakers from TERI, KPMG, Georgia State University, Sheffield Hallam University, Dublin City University, NITIE Mumbai and IIM Lucknow were invited.

The sessions spread over five days for the second program will cover the following sub–themes:

- **Introduction to Sustainable Development:** Global and Regional Context, the SDGs and the Paris Agreement, Evolution, Current Challenges, and Opportunities
- **Understanding Business Sustainability:** Business Logic for Sustainability, Difference between Sustainability, CSR, and Social Entrepreneurship, Regulatory framework including Section 135, Guidelines for PSUs, Business Responsibility Guidelines 2019 etc.,
- **Sustainable Finance:** Sustainability and Financial Performance, ESG Reporting, Impact Investing, Socially Responsible Investing (SRI), Green finance etc.
- **Sustainability Marketing:** Building Sustainable Brands, Sustainability as a Marketing Strategy, Greenwashing, Green marketing/social marketing etc.
- **Reporting Sustainability:** Stakeholder engagement and materiality analysis, BRR Framework of SEBI, GRI Standards, Integrated Reporting etc.
- **Sustainable Lifestyles and Leadership:** Models, Practices and Schools of Thought

## Pedagogy

The program will be delivered by academicians and industry experts in the field of sustainability. The participants will also be engaged in group practicum for application-based learning.

The focus will be on “interdisciplinary” and “practical” learning - that clearly aligns with the new **National Education Policy** and the **Sustainable Development Goals**. Each session, around a specific sub-theme, will address three fundamental questions – (a) Does it make business sense to invest in a sustainable business? (b) If yes, how can it be achieved? (c) What are the existing best practices in the

area? Case studies on leading practices as well as innovative policies promoting sustainable development at regional/national/global level will also be covered.

### Who can apply?

The programme is open to all the stakeholders including students, research scholars, faculty and staff members, representatives from industry, government, NGOs etc. All the registered participants would be given **study material** and **certificate of participation** (subject to fulfillment of attendance).

## About Jaipur

Jaipur is the capital of the state of Rajasthan, India. It was found in 1727 by Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II, the ruler of Amber, after whom the city is named. It is known as the Pink City. Originally the city was built as per the grid plan interpreted in light of vedic architecture. Some consider Jaipur as the first planned city of India. Jaipur, enriched in a culture of vibrance, valour and grandeur, is home to some of the most magnificent pieces of architecture in the country. With architectural marvels like Amber Fort, Nahargarh Fort, Jaigarh Fort, Jal Mahal, Hawa Mahal, City Palace, Jantar Mantar, along with a vibrant and colourful culture, Jaipur is a must visit on itinerary of any domestic/international tourist. Recently, the old part of city (popularly called Pink/Walled City) was named as World Heritage Site by UNESCO. UNESCO, while inscribing it as a World Heritage site, mentioned its heritage value owing to a city of exemplary amalgamation of and inter-change of Hindu, Mughal and contemporary western ideas that resulted in the form of the city.
