Established in 1963 as a joint venture of the Government of India and the Government of Rajasthan, Malaviya Regional Engineering College, Jaipur, started functioning with 30 students each in Electrical Engineering and Mechanical Engineering. The college shifted to its present campus in Jaipur in 1965. Spread over 125 hectares, the campus of MNIT enthralls and inspires. For teaching, the Vivekananda Lecture Theatre Complex is a fascinating piece of architecture inside the campus. It has 34,360 square meters covered area. The building is centrally air conditioned with 43 theatres with a seating capacity of 120 people and 6 theatres with a seating capacity of 240 people and smart classrooms equipped with solar panels on rooftop.



MNIT Innovation And Incubation Centre (MIIC)

MNIT Innovation and incubation centre is a Technology Business Incubator with a primary objective to provide a platform for Conceiving, Promoting & Nurturing knowledge based Innovation & Entrepreneurship amongst all the aspiring entrepreneurs. Various activities like startup Saturdays, MDPs, summer internship programs and investor meets are organized at regular intervals.



Prabha Bhawan

Prabha Bhawan not only serves as a main building for administrative offices but also for auditoriums named Niti Sabhaghar and Mini Auditorium. It financializes residents through a home branch for SBI and ICICI bank along with facilitating students by a 24/7 operational Computer Centre along with a dedicated debating room known as Language lab.



Dispensary

Primary Care Dispensary is available on campus. It is supervised by Medical Officers and two full-time nursing staff members. Also, services of a part-time Ayurvedic Doctor, a Homeopathy Doctor and a Gynecologist are available to students, staff and their family members. Examination and Evaluation

Education at the Institute is organized around the credit system of study. The prominent features of the credit system is process of continuous evaluation of a student's performance, and a flexibility to allow a student to progress at an optimum pace suited to his/her ability or convenience subject to fulfilling minimum requirement for continuation. Each course has a certain number of credits, which describe its weightage. A student's performance is measured by the number of credits that he/she has completed satisfactorily. A minimum Grade Point Average is required to be maintained for satisfactory process. Also a minimum number of earned credits should be obtained in order to qualify for the degree. Every course is coordinated by a member of the teaching staff of the department, which offers the course in a given semester. Scholarships

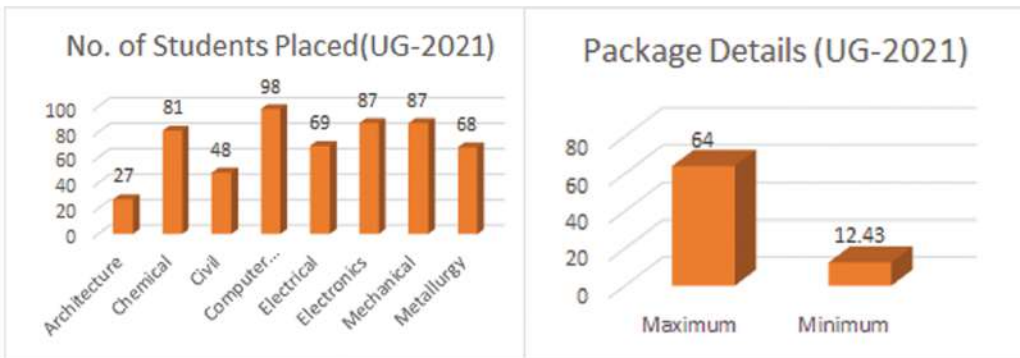

Everyone being from different cultural background, the students at MNIT not only have a great learning experience but the hostel life also makes it fun. Living in the serene campus, conceived by the genius architect Padma Shri, Shri A.P. Kanvinde, sprawling with trees and lush green lawns, keeps one connected to the nature, allowing them to possess the most treasured asset - peace of mind. Waking up to a breathtaking view of Aravali range, one is bound to look forward to their eventful day ahead. Over past many decades number of students residing in hostels has substantially increased. MNIT administration has also kept up pace in meeting the technological and academic requirements. New hostel buildings are under construction mean time some flats of Acharya Bhawan are being used as temporary Girls Hostel which are numbered as H13, B14, H15 and H17.

As a standard practice in the Institute students are compulsorily required to stay with room / corridor mates from different branches and state of domicile. Hence, allotment is done randomly and changed annually .

Committee of Students for Hostel and Mess Management

Institute through its hostel management follows the norms of nurturing leadership and community development ethics in its boarders. Every hostel and mess will have a Hostel and Mess Committee to manage respective hostel and mess. This includes organising hostel days, proposing improvement in infrastructure, formulate mess menu etc.

First point of Contact and Hierarchy of Communication

All the hostels at the entrance / reception areas have signage's with details of officials including their phone numbers. These numbers are also available at the Institute portal i.e. www.mnit.ac.in. Care taker of the hostel is the first point of contact including odd hours followed by warden(s). In case of no-solution he/she can approach respective Associate Deans i.e. Associate Dean (Students) for hostel management, Associate Dean (Mess) for mess management and Associate Dean (Discipline) for indiscipline issues. It is advised to all the new boarders that the contact numbers of their roommates along with that of Care Taker(s) and Warden(s) be shared with their guardians / parents

Emergency Numbers

All the hostels at the entrance / reception areas have signage's with details of emergency numbers like that of Security (9549891441, 9549891442), Ambulance (9549650438) and Electrician (9549650249) including their phone numbers. . These numbers are also available at the Institute portal i.e. www.mnit.ac.in.

Information Regarding Maintenance Issues in Hostel Room

Hostel management team ensures regular maintenance of all the hostel premises through the Estate Office. Boarders are just required to inform Hostel Care Takers through a register kept at Care Taker Office in every hostel for any cleanliness / maintenance need. Estate Section has initiated an online maintenance management system called "**Service Management System (SMS)**" which can be accessed through the link <http://sms.mnit.ac.in> by logging in through LDAP User Id and Password to raise the maintenance complaint and know it's progress.



Hostel 1 – Parijat

Inaugurated in 1964 named on account of a flower that blooms during night with accommodation of 72 and 108 students respectively in single and triple seater rooms with facilities like LED TV, carom boards, chess and many more in common rooms.



Hostel 2 – Chaitanya

Inaugurated in 1964, Currently home to B. Tech students in their I and II years, with a capacity of 72 students in single seater rooms and 108 students in triple seater rooms. Like Hostel 1, it has also experienced a great transformation.



Hostel 3 – Satpura

Inaugurated in 1965, near the JMP canteen and the Barber shop accommodating 72 seats in single seater rooms and 108 in triple seater rooms. A facility of Wi-Fi has been provided to the students residing in all hostels.

Hostel 4 – Lohit

Inaugurated in 1975 with a capacity of 72 students in single seater rooms and same capacity in double seater rooms. A facility of canteen is provided which is open 24 X 7. In case students miss their meals in mess, they can eat here even late at night.



Hostel 5 – Brihaspati

Inaugurated in 1986-87, with a capacity of 182 students having all single seater rooms. Along with a well-ventilated common room with good lighting it has facilities such as table tennis, chess carom, LED TV etc. are available in the common room.



Hostel 6 – Kabir

Inaugurated in 1997, with a capacity of 72 students in single seater rooms and 108 students in triple seater rooms. This hostel has a full-fledged facilities of common rooms, table tennis, WiFi and outdoor sports.





Hostel 7 – Drona

Immense greenery can be seen in the gardens spread across the premise of each hostel where students often come and sit. Earlier Inaugurated in 2004-05 with a beautiful aesthetic appeal has a capacity of 225 students in double seater rooms.



Hostel 8 – Varun

Hostel life is one of the most exciting thought for majority of college students. One more such hostel with infinite memories was built and Inaugurated in 2004-05 has a capacity of 212 students in single seater rooms, it accommodates B. Tech II year students.



Hostel 9 – Aurobindo

The MNIT campus was blessed with the presence of our former president, Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Sahib at the glittering inauguration ceremony in 2011. In the world of technology, internet has become a must to keep oneself up to date. It has world class facilities from the beginning like WiFi, LAN facility.

Vinodini Hostel

Inaugurated in 2019, MNIT offers DASA Students who are accommodated in this international level Hostel. The widespread building has a capacity of 461 students in single seater and 423 students in double seater rooms.



Girls Hostel

Hostel 1 – Maitri

Inaugurated in the year 1990. Block A consists of a mixture of single and double seater rooms with a capacity of 48 and 42 students respectively. On the other hand, Block B has triple seater rooms with a capacity of 136 students.



Hostel 2 – Gargi

Inaugurated in 2011 as the girls moved in their newly constructed single seater rooms. Total capacity of the hostel is 402. Students have a provision of various facilities such as LED television in common rooms. Washing machines are installed for the convenience of the students.



GENERAL CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE IN THE HOSTEL

1. Boarders should keep their rooms and hostel premises clean.
2. The boarder shall not damage any hostel property.
3. Students should switch off lights, fans etc. when they are not required. For the use of other electrical appliances, prior permission of Hostel Warden is necessary. They should agree to pay the electrical and water charges as per the Institute policy effective from time to time.
4. The boarders are not allowed to gamble, to consume intoxicants (narcotics, alcoholic, smoking etc.), nor are they allowed to have possession of them in hostel premises.
5. The boarders are not allowed to invite any lady guest into their rooms in boys' hostel.
6. The boarders are not allowed to accommodate guests in their rooms without written permission of the hostel authorities.
7. The boarders are not allowed to keep with them any fire arms or weapons even if they possess license thereof.
8. The boarders are not allowed to keep any pets in the hostel premises.
9. The boarders are not allowed to invite undesirable elements in hostel premises.
10. The boarders are not allowed for individual cooking etc. in the rooms or outside the hostel within the campus.
11. The boarders are not allowed to stay overnight out of their hostels or to go out of station without prior permission of the Warden concerned.
12. Any act of manhandling, group fighting, intimidation or violence, willful damage to property or drunken behavior constitutes a serious offense.
13. The boarders shall refrain from ragging the junior students in any form and violation of it will be treated as a gross misconduct.
14. The boarders shall not indulge in any act of theft, immoral acts, misbehavior with hostel/mess staff, spread of regionalism, communalism and casteism etc.
15. The boarders are expected to live in the hostel as a community and with a full sense of responsibility. They should behave with restraint and decorum and should not act in any fashion, which may cause disturbance to anybody. The boarders shall observe 10.00 PM to 6.00 AM as silence hours.

16. The boarders are not allowed to take any common room or mess property into their rooms except on issuance of the same.
17. The boarders are not allowed to play out door games other than those allowed by the Warden, in the hostel premises.
18. They are not allowed to convene any meeting in or around hostel without the permission of Warden.
19. They must abide by any other instructions conveyed by Director, DSW, AD(SW), and Warden from time to time for smooth functioning of Hostels.
20. The concerned hostel authorities may visit/inspect the rooms of boarders any time to ensure proper cleanliness and other discipline related matters.
21. The boarders should report back in the hostel before the specified time daily.
22. In case of any emergency all the boarders should report the matter to any institute employee on duty i.e. Chowkidar/Security guard/hostel caretaker/mess assistant/resident Warden immediately.
23. Boarder should not keep costly items like jewelry, electronic gadgets etc. They should buy insurance cover against theft and also keep proper security of their valuables. Hostel authorities shall not be responsible for any theft or damage.
24. The boarder must possess their identity cards with them all the time including while they are going out. Prior permission from the Warden should be sought before leaving the station.

GIRLS' HOSTEL SPECIFIC RULES

1. Every boarder should report back in the hostel before hostel timings, as notified by the hostel/institute authority. While going out of campus, proper entries have to be made in a register.
2. Residents going out of the hostel but within the campus like laboratories and library after the specified hostel times have to make proper entries in the IN-CAMPUS register, after seeking permission from the Warden. The entries should be made with proper details including the contact number of the lab/department.
3. Anyone leaving the station for going home/other places for weekend or for vacations must make a proper entry in the leave register and seek prior permission of the hostel Warden/resident warden.
4. No guests, including parents are allowed in the hostel.

5. Workers/electricians etc can visit the girls' rooms only after making proper entries and with the prior permission of the Warden/resident warden.
6. No boarder shall keep any heavy electrical appliance in their room like fridge, air-conditioner etc.
7. A Guest register has been kept at the reception counter. Residents should ensure that they make proper entries in that register when their guests visit.

HOSTEL ALLOTMENT POLICY

1) Following shall be the Priority for Hostel Allotment for Students

- 1st Priority: People with Differential - ability (PWD)
- 2nd Priority: Persons from Out Side India
- 3rd Priority: Persons from Out Side Rajasthan
- 4th Priority: Persons from Out Side Jaipur

2) Instructions

- (a) For taking possession after allotment the students must contact concerned warden/ caretaker along with Identity Card/ Admission letter and Residence Proof.
- (b) Any allotment done to any student from Jaipur should be treated as cancelled, and the fee shall be refunded.
- (c) The current allotment is liable to be cancelled. if possession is not taken within the time frame.

Students, who could not get hostel accommodation in the current round, may write to hosteloffice@mnit.ac.in there case shall be considered as and when vacancy arises.

POLICY REGARDING ANTI-RAGGING

WHAT IS RAGGING

1. Teasing, manhandling, ill-treating any fresher with rudeness.
2. Psychological harm that raises fear in the mind of freshers.
3. Asking the fresher to perform any act, this has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame so as to adversely affect his/her physique/ psyche.

RAGGING IS A PUNISHABLE ACT

No, acts of ragging shall be tolerated. Any act of ragging shall not go unnoticed and unpunished.

PUNISHMENTS MAY INCLUDE:

1. Expulsion from hostel.
2. Fine with public apology.
3. Withholding a scholarship or other benefit.
4. Debarring from representation in events or campus placement.
5. Adverse entry in Character Certificate.
6. Suspension from the institution.



DISCIPLINARY PENALTIES

If the appropriate authority is satisfied that a prima-facie case exists against the boarder he may be suspended from the hostel, pending a final enquiry. The outcome of which is to be announced not later than 30 days from such a suspension. Penalties fold on the boarder will be:

1. A boarder found to have violated any of Conduct & Discipline rules:
2. May be issued written/verbal warning.
3. May be placed on probation.
4. May be asked to tender a verbal/written public apology.
5. May be asked to do community service. May be fined up to a sum of Rs. 25000/-:
6. May be asked to call his/her-parents.
7. May be asked to make good any loss individually or jointly.
8. May be expelled from the hostel temporarily or permanently,
9. The case may be referred to the Institution Board of Discipline/Police.

INSTITUTE SECURITY CELL

The Institute has a well-trained and equipped security cell to ensure that students have a safe, secure and pleasant stay on campus.

Key instructions, from the cell, for new students follow.

1. Entry to the campus is prohibited after 10.00 PM.
2. Smoking, unwanted materials and powered vehicles of students are not allowed in the campus.
3. Carry the Institute Identity Card with you at all times and cooperate with the security personnel when asked to produce it. This would help the Security Personnel ensure that you belong to MNIT.
4. Management of campus security is performed by the on duty Security Supervisor. Security guards are directed by the on duty Security Supervisor and no one should make direct request/demand to them. If needed, submit your request via mail (security@mnit.ac.in)/Security Control.
5. Do not leave any valuables like laptops, mobile phones, watches etc. unattended, especially in the fields during physical activities.

International & Alumni Affairs Office

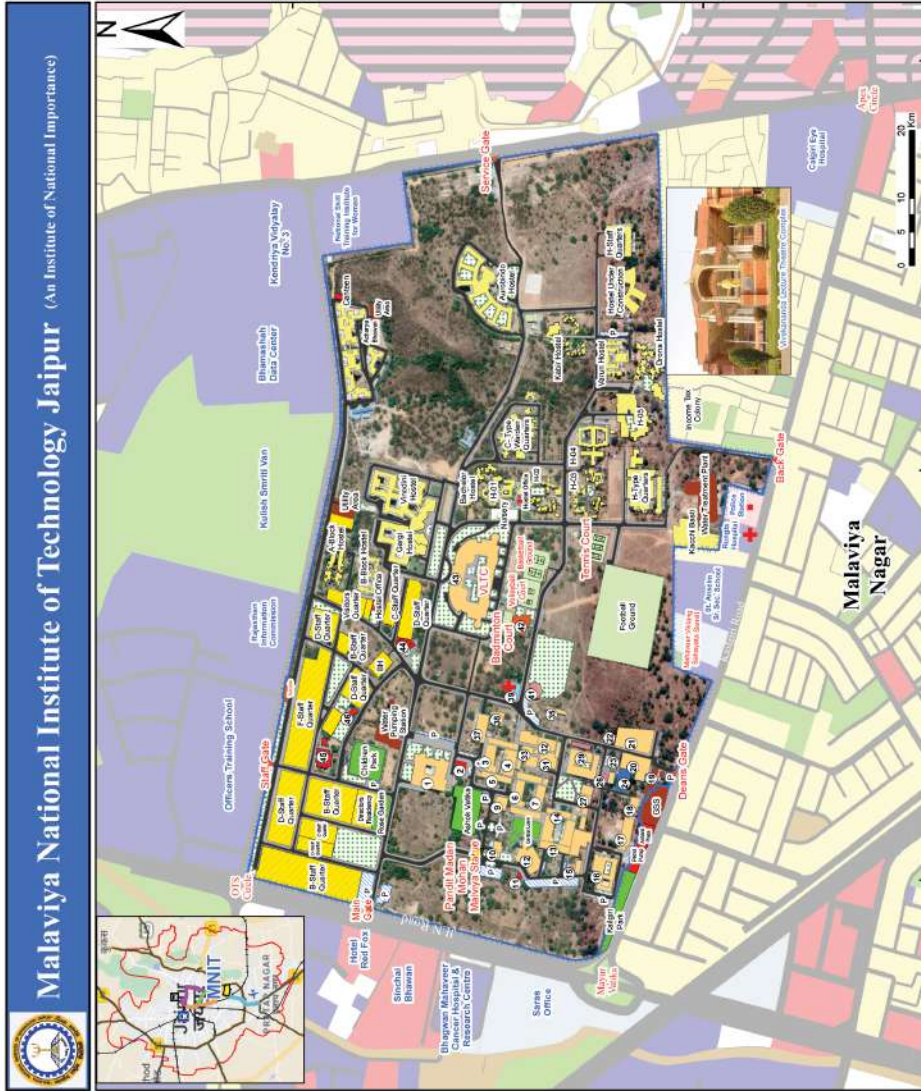

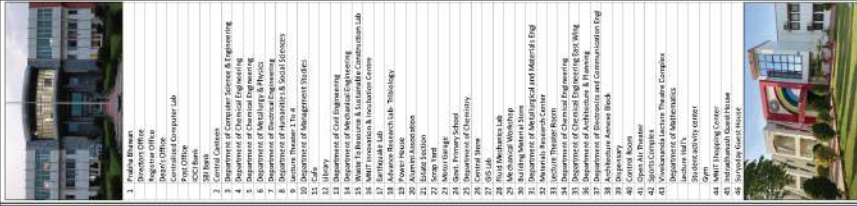
Campus Routes and Map
