Vision:

To involve the higher educational institutions (technical / non-technical / public / private) of the country in the process of indigenous development of self-sufficient and sustainable village clusters

Mission:

In accordance with the above mentioned vision, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan will strive to pursue the following:

- Develop the necessary mechanism and proper coordination among educational institutions, implementation agencies (District Administration / Panchayati Raj Institutions) and the grass root level stakeholders to enable effective intervention at the field level.
- Select suitable rural clusters and effectively participate in the holistic development of these clusters using eco-friendly sustainable technologies and local re-sources creating sufficient employment opportunities in the process, harnessing multifarious government schemes, Customised use of existing technologies and use of knowledge as per the local needs.
- Reorienting the academic curricula and research programs in higher educational institutions to make them more in alignment with the local needs to bring in holistic development and enrich knowledge of students about issues of villages / society.

Objectives:

- To engage the faculty and students of Higher Educational Institutions in understanding rural realities.
- To identify & select existing innovative technologies, enable customisation of technologies, or devise implementation method for innovative solutions, as per the local needs.
- To leverage the knowledge base of the institutions to devise processes for effective implementation of various government programmes.

Strategy:

- Capacity building in institutes of Higher Education in research and training relevant to national needs, especially those of rural India.
- Transformational change in rural development processes by leveraging knowledge institutions to help build the architecture of an Inclusive India.
- Aim to create a virtuous cycle between the Society, Government, and Higher Education system.

Role of Various Stakeholders of UBA

a. Sponsoring Ministry-MHRD:

The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India has launched the program of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA), a national program with the vision to involve the professional and other higher educational institutions of the country in the development of villages.

b. National Steering Committee (NSC):

An Empowered Steering Committee has been constituted by the Ministry of HRD for guidance and monitoring of the program at the national level and to provide direction and requisite thrust to the programme.

c. National Executive Committee (NEC):

National Executive Committee to take policy related decisions for Unnat Bharat Abhiyan.

The Committee will lead to the efforts by working with all the stakeholders, Institutions and State Governments.

d. National Coordinating Institute (NCI):

The Indian Institute of Technology Delhi is the National Coordination Institute (NCI) for the scheme. The NCI has the overall responsibility in monitoring and effective execution of the programme.

e. Regional Coordinating Institutions (RCIs):

In order to facilitate, guide and monitor the activities of the participating institutions (PIs), 44 Regional Coordinating Institutions (RCIs) are identified on the basis of their earlier experience and infrastructural competence etc.

The responsibilities of RCIs are:

- RCIs will act as nodal centres for promoting & facilitate UBA network in their region.
- RCIs will groom PIs of the region to design innovative solutions for the identified-challenge.
- RCIs is responsible to facilitate, guide and monitor the activities of Participating Institutions in their region.

f. Participating Institutions:

Any Higher Educational Institute which accept to work for Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, can do so by applying online on UBA website. The responsibilities of PIs are:

- As part of the programme it is mandatory to adopt five villages' in consultation with the District collectors for the development activities under the UBA.
- Institutions are expected to do field studies, study the implementation of Government schemes, and facilitate their better implementation so that they meet their objectives best.
- PIs should engage interested faculty members & students, NSS and other bodies of the institutes engaged in community development activities.
- The selected PIs will work with State Government, district authorities / PRIs / other institutions and non-governmental bodies, for arriving at suitable solutions for improving the social and economic well-being of the rural communities.

g. Subject Expert Group Institutions (SEGs):

The Subject Expert Groups are institutions which have been appointed by the UBA for providing operational expertise sought by the institutions engaged in the rural work. The responsibilities of SEGs are:

- To support PIs through a group of experts in their respective subject area.
- Preparation of the compendium of relevant technologies.
- To recommended and approve technical intervention & customization project submitted by PIs



Support from UBA to Participating Institutes:

- Funds for Awareness, survey, visits etc @₹ 10000/- per village
- Technical Intervention ₹ 1.0 lakh per technology for implementation in the village
- Customization of Technology ₹ 50000/- per solution for villages

Future Possibilities in Pipeline:

• To incentivize the PIs who will generate additional funds for UBA activities, if they generated additional funds from other sources.
